We would appreciate it if you could give a brief summary of the contents, focus on the qualities and relevance of the book to international social work and avoid introducing a large number of other references or additional material. You may wish to provide a critical overview of the book, given the short length of the review keep it brief and focused.

Instructions for Book Review Authors

When completing your review please bear in mind the following guidelines:

- Suggested word length is 500-800 words.
- Please include the title of the book, author of book, publisher's details and ISBN number in your review (and price if available).
- The review should be English.
- Please complete a contributor form for your book review otherwise we won't be able to publish your review on the website.
- Please return the review by email to <u>isw@durham.ac.uk</u> within 4 weeks of receiving the book.

We recognise it is hard to meet deadlines but we need your support if the book review section of the journal is to be a vibrant and interesting one. If at any stage you have difficulties meeting this 4 week deadline please let the Editorial Office know.
